Dear All,

ONCE more Christmas is upon us when, perhaps, we can escape from the reality of the modern world with its horrors of war and conflict, cost of living crises and the effects of climate change and, for a week or two at least, enter into the celebrations of this special time of the year; the parties, the turkey, the family gatherings, the presents, the carols, and all the things associated with the modern Christmas. shining in the darkness of this world in

Once more, no doubt, come January 1st 2024, the short escape will be forgotten and it will be back to reality. Many will be left feeling empty and lost. Some will content themselves with the fact that it was marvelous while it lasted. Others will wonder whether it was all worthwhile. For some it will have been a painful time. There will have been no escape for those caught up in war.

Those without families, those who mourn, those who are poor, will not have been able to take part fully in the partying and the present giving and the family gatherings and some will be glad that the festivities are over but, of course, as wonderful as they are for those that can enjoy them, Christmas is about far more than parties, present giving and family gatherings and an escape from the reality of life.

The real truth of Christmas is good news for all; not just until January 1st but for eternity. God, in his love for us, enters into the reality of human life. He

sees the pain and the suffering of the world: the selfishness and greed that prevents us from experiencing that love and comes to be with us as a helpless, homeless child; as a victim of injustice, cruelty, selfishness and greed and, in love, overcomes them through the crucifixion and resurrection.

He comes in Jesus and stands with us in the mess. He becomes the light order to lead us and carry us towards salvation. He comes to show us that the way to know him and the peace which passes understanding, the peace that we all long for, is not experienced by escaping from reality, even though, at times like Christmas, almost every part of us is telling us to do just that, but by engaging with it as he did; giving of our very selves to God and to those around us so that we too are heralds of the good news of the gospel of God's love.

The good news of Christmas is fantastic news for all whether we are three or 93, caught up in the horrors of war, rich or poor, surrounded by family, or bearing the loss of a loved one. Because of Jesus' birth, life. death and resurrection we know that God is with us; loving us with a love that cannot be destroyed and that is news in which we can all rejoice.

New Bus Services

There have been significant changes to the bus service to and through Hethersett. Here is a quick rundown of the new services.

Number six goes along the B1172 as it previously did.

Number 11 goes through the village and to and from the Norfolk and Norwich Hospital as it previously did.

Number 13 goes along the B1172.

Number 14 takes the place of the old number 15 and goes through the village.

Number 15 now goes along the B1172 and not through the village.

Number 16 goes along the B1172

The Ourbus service goes through the village to the Longwater Retail Park on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays.

Lowering Speed Limit

THE speed limit along a section of Colney Lane in Hethersett is likely to be lowered from 60 to 40 mph in the near future.

A letter from Norfolk County Council has outlined the proposal:

"Norfolk County Council is planning to convert the existing national (60 mph) speed limit on Colney Lane/Hethersett Lane to 40 mph.

"The proposed 40 mph will extend from Hethersett Lane's roundabout with Rosalind Franklin Road south to its junction with Norwich Road."

Hethersett Parish Council agreed unanimously that the reduction in the speed limit was "an excellent idea."

Plans still exist to put traffic lights at the junction of Colney Lane and the B1172.

Hethersett District and County Councillor David Bills has also backed the plans: "I am strongly supportive. Safety-wise this is definitely needed. People seem to think that because it's a 60 mph zone you have to drive at 60 mph," he told the Norwich Evening News.

Post Office Celebrates First Birthday

HETHERSETT'S community post office celebrated its first birthday in Hethersett Library at the end of October.

The post office is an example of the Hethersett community working together for the benefit of all. Post office staff, library staff, volunteers and local councillors came together in the library to celebrate the birthday with coffee and cake. Hethersett County and District Councillor David Bills praised everyone for making a success of the venture since the former office in Oak Square closed.



The post office is run by two paid staff and a host of volunteers under the auspices of the Hethersett Hearts charity. The post office also has five unpaid volunteer directors as a Community Interest Company (CIC).

"This is certainly something to celebrate and shows once again what Hethersett can do thanks to the hard work of so many people including the post office staff, the volunteers, Hethersett Hearts and the county council. What we have to offer is brilliant and I haven't received a single complaint since the post office opened in the library," Councillor Bills said.

Fellow County Councillor Margaret Dewsbury, cabinet member for communities and partnerships, also praised the initiative:

"This works so well. Libraries are the public face of the county council. It is certainly unusual to have a post office in a library but it fits in beautifully with all the other groups and things going on here," she said.

One of the two paid staff, Alison Barnard, thanked the library staff for making them "so welcome."

Hethersett Post Office is open six days a week and only closed on Sundays. Our photograph shows post office and library staff and volunteers at the birthday celebrations where refreshments were paid for by the Friends of Hethersett Library Group.



JIM Payne of Walnut Tree Nursery spoke about climate change and its amelioration by changes to our gardening practices.

Commencing with the "technical side" of a high altitude thin layers of gas, carbon dioxide, methane et al, which retain solar energy and effectively regulate the world's temperature, Jim continued with a summary going back millions of years, ice ages, sea levels rising and falling, and how 200 years of industrialisation has increased that gas layer's thickness, making the world a warmer place.

He then proceeded to show how the natural world has gone on to reflect that over arching process. Beware the "Colorado Beetle" and its affect on certain crops; it's been seen in southern England; the Environmental Agency must be informed if it is spotted. We continued to the present day's developing climate patterns and finally choices of crops and grasses for drought prone areas and coping with peat free compost when raising seedlings.

Hethersett Gardening Club meets on the third Wednesday of each month apart from December, which is usually on the second Wednesday, at 7.30 pm in the Methodist Church Hall. Great Melton Road. Hethersett.

Honor, her two chums and dogs Caesar and Kaiser hired a horse drawn caravan from a Mr Trenoik. He accompanied them. He looked after the horse and if the horse couldn't pull them up a hill, he hired another. Their maid, back at their home in North Wooton, helped prepare the caravan with essential supplies. The girls had obviously planned their route calling in at acquaintances along the way. They could be given tea or perhaps they may have a field where they could camp. They were only travelling across North Norfolk and then back across the centre part of the county. It took two weeks. Honor kept a diary of their travels. It's an hilarious account of their expedition. She describes the scenery from the sandy beaches, the sand dunes, mud flats and salt marshes to the cliffs of Cromer and Overstrand. They then trundled south. Villages like Poringland and Hingham were mentioned. It was an interesting and fun trip for them. Within a short time, with rumours of War, the girls left for France where they were to become nurses. Many members went to a group meeting along with members from other local Institutes. The title of the talk was "From Bed and Breakfast to Bed and Bondage." I didn't know what to expect. The talk wasn't mentioned in the WI book of recommended speakers, but it was incredibly funny and I think most of us realised what naïve and sheltered lives we have had. During the month we have enjoyed walks and meals together at our local hostelry.

We will Remember Them



UNIFORMED groups joined with residents to fill St Remigius Church for the annual Remembrance Sunday Service when the village remembered those who gave their lives in the service of their country in the two World Wars.

Before the service inside the church there was an act of remembrance around the war memorial with the names of those commemorated on the memorial being read



Organisations then laid wreaths around the war memorial. These included the Royal British Legion, Hethersett Methodist Church, Old Comrades, Hethersett Parish Council, Hethersett Brownies, Hethersett Rangers and Guides, Hethersett Explorer Scouts, First Hethersett Cubs, First Hethersett Scouts, First Hethersett Beavers, First Hethersett Squirrels. The service inside the church was led by the Venerable Martin Gray, assisted by Rev Cullis. In his address to a packed church Rev Gray talked about the positive steps taken towards peace since the fall of the Berlin Wall almost 34 years to the day.

He spoke about the shoots of hope despite the "thousands of victims of evil in our World." He praised the Scouting movement which he has been a part of for 70 years. "Young people have such an important part to play in uniting people in common humanity," he said adding that sadly today we have many thousands of additional people to remember than when the Berlin wall fell. He spoke of the brutality and wickedness of war.





